

GRASS ON SANDY SOIL

YOUR MONTH-BY-MONTH FIELD NOTES

Use months as reminders; local weather, grass growth and establishment stage take priority. Move freeze preparation ahead of your first local freeze, even if earlier than shown.

01 JANUARY Sketch the soil areas Do not assume the whole yard has the same sand content or rooting depth.	02 FEBRUARY Review the test Keep soil recommendations with your grass identity and actual lawn measurements.	03 MARCH Inspect irrigation Check leaks, blocked heads and sandy edges when the system is operating.
04 APRIL Measure coverage Compare matching catch-cup depths before changing watering frequency.	05 MAY Inspect roots and moisture Compare one dry patch with healthy turf after watering.	06 JUNE Log rainfall Combine rainfall and irrigation in one record rather than using the timer alone.
07 JULY Check exposed edges Wind and heat may dry one strip before the rest of the lawn.	08 AUGUST Make one adjustment Recheck root-zone moisture after changing a setting; avoid extending every zone.	09 SEPTEMBER Plan repairs by grass Use a suitable establishment season and protect the repaired area.
10 OCTOBER Reassess after weather shifts Reduce or adjust irrigation when rainfall and growth change.	11 NOVEMBER Protect the equipment Follow the equipment manual for freezing conditions where relevant.	12 DECEMBER Compare the log Identify which areas repeatedly dried out and which stayed wet.
